ANDERSON

No. 1 — Oblong standing stone c Inscription East to West sides and between McGrath and Watson.

See **McGRATH**.

"Erected to the memory of Lieut. James Anderson of 71st Reg. who fell — In the cause of his County and of Europe in the action — at the town of Are in France 17th March 1814"

Above — East Side

West side

"Here lie the remains of Mrs. Margaret Anderson, wife of Mr. Roger Anderson of Kilkenny, who died Oct, 31st 1818? in the 68th year of her age having truly experienced the Peace of God which surpassed all understanding"

"Also the remains of Jane, daughter of Mr. John Anderson who died Sept. 20th 1819? aged — yrs, also the remains of Mr. Roger Anderson husband to above Margaret who died June 20th 1820 aged — ? yrs."

ARCHER (1)

No. 2 — Facing Bryan Vault.

Flat stone beside Bailey and almost under Edmund Madden (Comerford).

"Here lyes the body of Michael Archer who dyed — Nov — aged 66 yrs. Also his wife Mrs. Mary Archer al **Reade** (?) who dyed Nov. 19th 1780 aged 70 yrs. and several of their children"

ANDREWS (1)

No. 3 — Floor Slab in Monument Room.

"Here lyeth ye body of the Revd. W. Andrews, Archdeacon and Vicar-General of the Diocese of Ossory who died the first day of Nov. 1736 in the 55 year of his age. His children Ann Andrews born Dec. 29. 1704.

James Andrews born Dec. 11. 1703

died July 7, 1707

Elizabeth Andrews born Dec. 30, 1705

died July VI. 1719.

Grandchildren —

James and Ann Andrews."

ANDREWS (2)

No. 4—(also in Monument Room) Floor Slab.

Anne the daughter of Wm & Anne Andrews, born Decerm XXIX, died Jan XII. MDCCIV.

James Andrews born Decem MDCCIII died July MDCCVII.

Elizabeth Andrews born Decem XXX MDCCV died July VI. MDCCXLX.

ARMSTRONG

No. 5—Flat tombstone below Gilbert Robertson (to right of Ch. Gate) and under wall of Church.

BLUNT

"Hic jacet Ann Johan Armstrong Armigeri Dilectissima uxos filius Anthony Blunt Kilkenniensis. Armiger. Oct —"

"Here lieth the body of Dorothy Blunt al **Date** daughter to Ald. Antony Blunt the Elder and mother to the above Ann — who died Jan —"

"Here lieth the body of Mr. Antony Blune the Elder., Alderman of the City — in the year of our Lord Died Sept 1717 aged 59 years."

Sheriff in 1713-14.

No. 7—See p.96, 97, Carrigan Vol. 3. **BRYAN VAULT.**

BIRCH

No. 8—Monument Room. Small Slab with Coat of Arms (under Wm. Shee).

"Here lyeth the boddy of George Birch Esq. who departed this life in June 1720.

Heare lyeth the boddy of Mrs. Margery Birch, wife to William Birch of the City of Kilkenny, Gen, Departed this life 10 Avgvst 1693."

N.B.—George Birch, Mayor in 1699.

BRYAN (1)

No. 9—One of three stones lying against Chancel wall to left inside Gate.

N.B.—See p.153 of Journal of Memorials.

"Erected by Mr. James Bryan of the City of Kilkenny, hatter in memory of his Wife Elizabeth Bryan al **Grundy** who depd. May 28th 1795 aged 52 yrs, with two of their children Samuel & Martha."

BRYAN (2)

No. 10—Flat Stone (1 of 3) under wall of Church facing South.

I.H.S.

"Here lyes the body of John Bryan 1722"

BARRY

No. 11—Half covered upright stone near Thomas Budds and beside tree stump (see Kavanagh Monument).

"Here lieth the body of Dennis Barry etc., etc., (rest buried)

BAXTER

- No. 12**—Flat tombstone between Robertson Tomb and Church.
 "Here lies the bodies of Mr. Samuel Baxter and his wife Mrs. Catherine Baxter alias **Morres** both natives of England, the former died 4th Feb 1776 aged 86, the latter died 23rd June 1778 aged 80 yrs."

BAILIE

- No. 13**—Flat stone almost facing Parkes Tomb 5 feet from boundary wall and next to Graham.
 "Here lieth the body of Hans Bailie, Alderman of the City of Dublin who dep. this life at Kilkenny April 3rd 1773 aged 73 yrs also his daughter Mary who died ——"
N.B.—**Lettering on this stone is very large.**

BOWERS

- No. 14**—Altar Tomb (high) to the back and right of Robertson.
 "Beneath this tomb lie the mortal parts of John Bowers Esq., who resigned his spirit into his Creators hands on ——
 "Called by the goodness of God"

 Also wife of above John Bowers and daughter of —— **Davis** late of Bonnetsrath Esq., who died — Oct 1806.

BLACK

- No. 15**—Large Altar Tomb beside Loftus Nunn (very old and worn).
 "— John Black, City of Kilkenny Apothecary."

BROPHY

- No. 16**—Celtic Cross. Bibbys (Almshouse) side.
 "Erected by Michael Brophy Esq., P.C. in memory of his beloved wife Anastasia Brophy who dep. this life May 24th 1875 aged 32 years

BUDDS

- No. 17**—Beside Colclough and near Kavanagh Tomb.
 "In memory of Thomas Budds, born 13th Jan 1826. died Sept. 11th 1870 aged 44 yrs. also in loving remembrance of Benjamin Budds who died 13th Feb 1916 aged 40 yrs."
No. 24 Lower Walkin St.
N.B.—(? **Dunmore family**) **JENKINSTOWN**.

BRACKIN

No. 18—Floor slab to left of Gate and over Robertson.

"Sacred to the memory of Wm. Henry Brackin Esq., for many years Recorder of this City of Kilkenny who departed this life on 7th day of June 1817 aged 55 yrs."

This stone was placed by his Masonic brethren of the Leinster Interior Lodge No. 57.

BUTLER (1)

No. 19—Large Monument with Coat of Arms and Urn on top. Back of Church.

"Here lie interred the remains of Mrs. Elizabeth Butler who dep. this life 13th May 1773 aged 76 years

also

the remains of Thomas Butler Esq. her husband, for many years, an Eminent Physician in this City. He dep. this life 30th July 1773 aged 80 yrs.

also

the remains of their son Thomas Butler Esq. M.D. who dep. this life 21st July 1795 in the 72nd year of his life."

Eulogy follows.

Doric Monument with fluted columns.

Butler family occupied the Bridge House during the building of John's Bridge (Egan's Guide).

BUCHANAN

BUTLER (2)

No. 20—Ground Slab underneath Hugh Gregg and next to Peter Wall. Slab decorated with circle enclosing winged bird and "Gloria in Excelsis" on scroll carried by 2 angels and 2 smaller angels blowing trumpets. Although top part is nicely carved a very crude Skull and Crossbones is at bottom.

"Here lie; the body of Mr. Michael Butler of the City of Kilkenny Printer who departed this life on the 1st day of May 1779 aged 41 years."

"May the Lord have mercy on his Soul. Amen."

BOURKE

No. 21—Small upright stepped stone to right below slated tombstone of Leigh.

"Here lyes ye body of Patrick Bourke who dep. May 9th 1761 aged 22 yrs."

BUTLER (3)

No. 22—Altar Tomb beside Hampden Hely (behind Church).

"Here lieth the body of Captn. Richard Butler of the City of Kilkenny who departed this life — 1790 —

"He lived beloved and died lamented by his acquaintances."

BAILLIE

No. 23—Square slab set into wall (King St.) behind Hatton Mon. (Back of Church).

"To the memory of Marianne Baillie only child of G. C. Buchanan proprietor of the English Academy. In a short but estimable life she had all those virtues and qualities of head and heart which shed lustre on the several relations, of Daughter, Wife, Mother and friends. In a long and painful Distemper she displayed an all embracing edifying, fortitude, patience, and resignation with true piety and christian hope, which alone can inspire" "She died May 9th 1819 in her 19th year. This Monument is erected by a father whose affliction is deep as could be."

LA BARTHE

No. 24—Upright stone facing end wall (Almshouse).

"Erected by Mr. Thomas la Barthe. City of Kilkenny, in memory of his dearly beloved wife Margaret who departed this life 3rd March 1869 in the 65th year of her age, and of his youngest and beloved daughter Annie who died 12th of April 1873 aged 22 yrs, also in memory of the above Thomas la Barthe who died Jan 4th 1875 aged 73 yrs, and of his son John la Barthe who departed 27th Oct. 1884 aged 53 yrs." Thos. la Barthe, Rose Inn St., Parade End.

BUTLER (4)

No. 25—Altar Tomb beside and under wall Slab of Mrs. S. Hartford Bibbys (Almshouse) side.

"To the memory of Francis Butler who fell asleep in Jesus Oct. 7th 1811 aged 58 years, also his youngest daughter Catherine Mary (lying in the same grave with her father) who died Mar 21st 1815 aged 9 years 3 mths also his youngest son Francis interred at Kilmanagh who died April 21st 1811 nearly 9 months old."

BREHON

No. 26—Taken from Col. Vigers Book.

"Pray for ye soul of Mrs. Anstis Brehon als Blanchvil Wife of Mr. John Brehon who departed this life ye 12th day of Aprile 1724 in ye 51 year of her age, with 7 of her Children who are interd here."

BLUNT (1)

No. 27—Flat stone to right of Sweeny and near Celtic Cross.

"Here lieth the body of Henery Blunt Esq., of Clashwilliam who dep. this life 12th Feb. 1789 in 36th yr of his age"

BULGER

- No. 28**—Flat T. stone beside Slate T. stone of Leigh.
 "Erected by Cathrine Bulger alias **Dwyer** in memory of her husband Paul Bulger who depd. this life 20th July 1801 aged 60 also 9 of their children." R.I.P.

BAILY (3)

- No. 29**—Flat stone beside Mgt. Morres (Back of Church).
 "Here lies the body of Mrs. Mary Baily wife of Clayton Baily of Gowran Esq., daughter of Sir William Evans **Morres** of Kilkreene. Bart
 She was a fond wife and affectionate parent, a sincere friend and unbounded in her Charity. She died 9th Nov. 1789 aged 64 years."

BLUNDEN

- No. 30**—Flat stone beside Enery Mon. very smooth and illegible.

BLAKE

- No. 31**—Upright stone near Almshouse wall and facing Macken.
 See **REYNOLDS No. 2.**
 "Erected by John Blake of 16th Reg. of Foot in memory of his wife Sarah who depd. this life Nov. 25th 1817 aged 26 yrs."

BELFOW

- No. 32**—Small (very old) upright stone facing King St. wall.
 "Here lieth the body of Piery Belfow who dep. this life 27th Scep. 1736 in the 30th yr of his age"

BRAND

- No. 33**—Upright stone facing King St. wall (Pierts end).
 "In memory of Edmond son of Daniel & Elizabeth Brand of East Haring in the County of Norfolk who died 9th April, 1842 aged 3 yrs 1 month"

BLEAKE

BUTLER

- No. 34**—Wall slab in Monument Room with Coat of Arms—
 "Comme je trouve"
 "In loving memory of Francis Butler Esq. J.P. of Borrismore, Co. Kilkenny who fell asleep in Jesus Oct 7th 1844 aged 38, also his youngest son Thomas who died April 24th 1845 aged 9 mths and his youngest daughter Catherine Mary who died Mar 24th 1845 aged 9½ mths, also in memory of Dorothea widow of above who fell asleep in Jesus Aug 19th 1897 aged 78, also Edmund their eldest son who died of Sunstroke near New York, June 28th 1876 aged 37"
 Erected by their sorrowing and last child Sophie.

BAILEY (1)

- No. 35**—Small upright stone behind Wade and below Potter St.
 "Sacred to the memory of Mrs. Anne Bailey wife of Mr. B. Bailey, Organist of the Cathedral of St. Canice who died 30th May 1833 in the 49th yr of her age."
 "This stone is erected as tribute of filial affection by her daughter Mrs. Anne **Wade**"

BAILEY (2)

No. 36—Flat stone beside above.

"In memory of Anne Bailey died May 1833 aged 49 yrs.
Edward Lawless died July 1853 aged 85 yrs. Jane Lawless
wife of William Lawless died Oct 1862 aged 58 yrs.
Bettesworth Bailey Lawless son of Wm. & Jane Lawless died
Jan 1868 aged 33 yrs."

BOOTH

BAKER

No. 37—Flat stone lying to left of Bryan Vault Gate.

"Erected to the memory of Bob Baker of Aghenure Esq.,
who dep. this life Oct. 1800 aged 26 yrs also his brother
Henry Baker Esq. who died March 1809 aged 29 yrs.

BROWNE

No. 38—Large upright stepped stone beside Eliot and in front of Bryan Vault.

"Erected by Michael Potter in memory of his father in Law
Mr. Ed. Browne of the City of Kilkenny who died May 12th
1810 aged 69 yrs. also his wife Bridget Browne al Freeman
died May 1st 1788 aged 36 yrs & of their Grandchildren."
