Dear Sir:

On the night of the 11th February 1921, the Black and Tans burst in the door and pulled myself and my son and daughter out of bed; put us up against the wall of the yard in our night attire; scattered petrol all over the house and ourhouses, - and after killing all my fowl, set the whole premises on fire - sacks of corn, hay and everything I possessed.

Being a Farmer, I had neither seed nor money to carry on agricultural pursuit.

At the time I was down and out I received £15 from the White Cross, so that, with a little help, got me out of the difficulty for the time being. Later I received a Loan to repair my premises - the sum of £200. 0. 0, through the Reconstruction Commission of the White Cross.
